KEY VERSE: Acts 2:21

*And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. (Acts 2:21, NIV)*

BACKGROUND ...

“Saved from what?” That’s what we used to think whenever someone approached us with a message of *salvation*. Most people believe in a "god" of some kind, though they don't know who He is. They're even willing to readily accept that this God is holy. When pressed, they might even recognize that they are not holy. And that's where the rubber meets the road. An unholy man cannot mix with a holy God. Furthermore, an unholy man cannot make himself holy. And it is SIN that makes us

unholy. So we need to be saved from our sin if we ever hope to be with Holy God. Personally, it took me a long time to realize that, but when I did, there was no turning back. The good news is, all I ever had to do was call on the name of the Lord (Acts 2:21)! The name that saves us is Jesus -- Yeshua (Acts 4:12). And our salvation took place on Mt. Zion in Jerusalem (Joel 2:32). Whatever is going on in your life today, call on His name and give thanks to the Lord! Do it today -- right now! Let's talk!
