KEY VERSE: Prov 18:22

He who finds a wife finds what is good and receives favor from the Lord.
(Prov 18:22, NIV)

BACKGROUND ...

In this verse, God connects *finding a wife* with *finding something that is good*. He goes on to say that a man who has found a wife has also found favor with God. In other words, not only does he have a wife, but he also has God's blessings! Not every man who reads this will agree. In fact, if you asked Adam, there was a time he probably would have disagreed too. He never got into trouble until Eve was on the scene. Yet God, in His infinite wisdom, chose for the two of them to remain together

until death separated them. God knew that it was worse for Adam to be alone than it was for Adam to have a wife who was less than perfect. God knew that Adam's wife would be a greater blessing to him than being alone would be. Even if you're not married, you can benefit from this discussion. As you talk and pray about this topic, you will discover that "oneness" is an important key to discipleship. Let's talk the talk!

BIKER BIBLE GROUP DISCUSSION ...

1. Why do you think the writer of this passage wrote it? What was he thinking? What was his purpose(s)?
2. We know God is the true Author of all Scripture. What do you think God wants us to know and do with (about) this passage?
3. Why is this Bible passage important to bikers today? What can we learn from it? How should we respond to it?
4. What's going on in the world around us today that this message speaks to? How can (should) believers use this message to influence our families and communities?
5. What other questions (points) would you like to ask the group or what other points would you like to make?

DISCIPLESHIP CHALLENGE: Based on the Scripture and your group discussions ...

1. What do you need to start doing in your life?
2. What should you probably stop doing?
3. What things could you pray about changing with God's help?

NOTE: The "Disciple Challenge" is to actually take action on at least one of the questions above!

CLOSING COMMENTS ...

- What were some of the Key Thoughts and ideas from today's group discussion? What do you remember about the discussion? What stands out as important?
- If you could suggest one thing to the rest of the group to take away from this discussion, what would it be?
